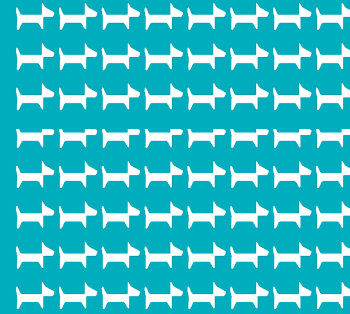

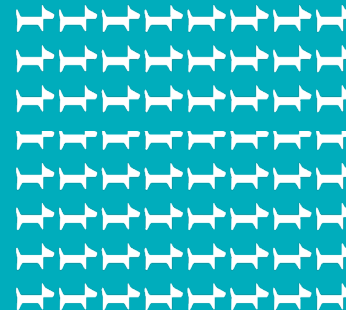

# RESCUE

Despite the challenges of 2020, our rescue efforts in Los Angeles and Nashville have exceeded our expectations. By saving more than 1,500 dogs, our team has maintained focus on making the biggest impact possible on the euthanasia crisis. Due to lack of center visitors and walk-ins because of COVID-19, our strategy behind housing dogs at the center has shifted. In 2020 we kept the number of dogs at the center as low as possible and utilized fosters much more. One of our biggest challenges was pivoting from rescuing dogs from local Los Angeles city and county shelters to working with a number of independent groups, which enabled us to create new lasting partnerships. It is likely city and county shelters will continue to be challenging to work with going forward, so building upon these new relationships will be paramount in 2021. Our team will continue to reassess our needs, focused on saving as many family-friendly dogs as possible through our rescue program.

# MAMA BELL

ADOPTED  
2020

Found wandering the streets as a stray, Mama Bell had a pregnant belly that was almost as big as she was. When we received the urgent request for help, we knew we had to take action quickly to get her to safety at our West Los Angeles adoption center before going into labor. She was terrified, defensive, and completely unsure of where she was, let alone what was happening to her body. Instead of giving birth alone and exposed on the street, Bell was surrounded by our loving, caring staff. Shortly after delivering 8 puppies, our expert medical team stepped in and quickly identified a contagious skin infection affecting the litter. After months of care, Mama Bell and all of her puppies were completely healed and adopted into their forever homes.



# ADOPTION

While foot traffic to our adoption center may have drastically decreased in 2020, we received more adoption applications than ever before. With nearly 12,000 people interested in adopting a rescue dog, our team worked diligently to find the best forever homes for 906 dogs in Los Angeles. To better accommodate the restrictions of COVID-19, we transitioned away from conducting Meet & Greets at the adoption center, and moved to a seven day Foster to Adopt trial period, which increased adoptions and resulted in more successful matches. Not only was our team able to continue our adoptions efforts remotely, and with increased protocols, but we exceeded our adoptions goals by finding homes for more dogs in 2020 than the previous year.

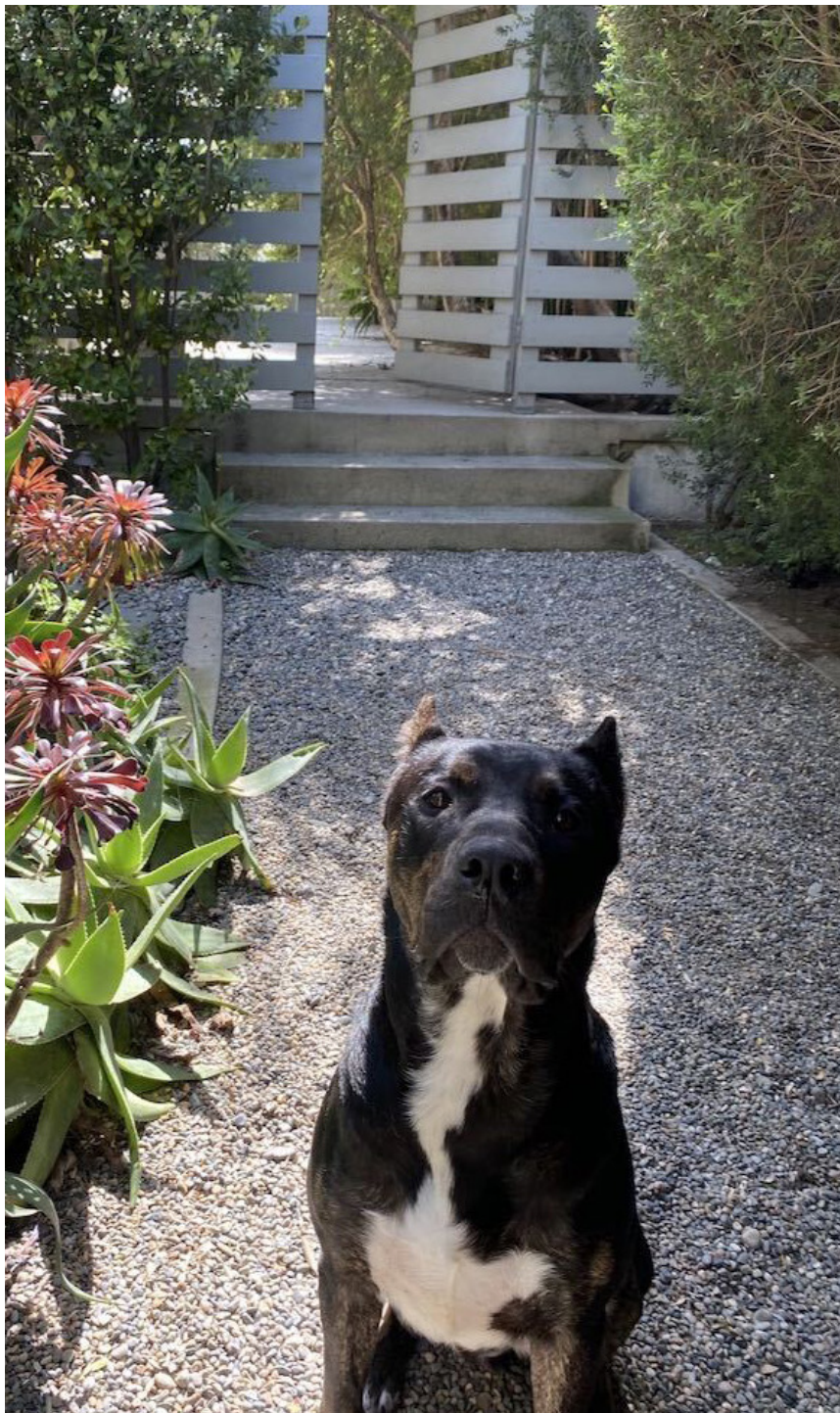

## ELF | ADOPTED 2020

After spending half of his life as a junkyard dog before being abandoned at the shelter, Elf was rescued by Wags & Walks. This sweet, gentle giant suffered from a serious case of ringworm that required weeks of medical care. 175 days later, he was welcomed into a temporary foster home with two tiny chihuahuas. It didn't take long for his foster family to realize he was right where he was always meant to be. Now named Bubs, he is living his best life with his forever family.



# FOSTER

With a 600% increase in foster applications in 2020, our foster team drastically pivoted our training and onboarding process. We created a more detailed application, a new approval process, updated email templates, and conducted more email and phone interviews than ever before. More than 750 dogs were cared for in a foster home in 2020, while our team provided constant support and training until dogs were matched with a forever home. Our foster team played a critical role in our ability to save and find homes for so many dogs during the pandemic and because of this, our program is now more robust and efficient than ever.

# ILIANA | FOSTER

# VOLUNTEERS

When the Los Angeles Shelter at Home order was issued in March, we closed our center to the public and moved all of our dogs into foster homes. In September we safely reopened Wags Club, our volunteer dog walking program, to our core volunteer community. We implemented extensive COVID safety protocols and limited volunteers to a maximum of two onsite at any given time. Despite a five month hiatus, over 4,000 Wags Club volunteer hours were logged in 2020. Additionally, roughly 300 volunteer transports to/from the vet and local shelters were completed. Volunteers expressed more interest in transporting during this time, as it provided a way to stay involved with limited contact. Although we were unable to onboard new volunteers during 2020 and about 30% of our volunteer base reported that they stopped volunteering due to concerns around COVID-19, about 25% of our currently active volunteer base started volunteering in 2020. Despite the challenges faced in 2020, our volunteer appreciation increased and volunteers rated their overall experience during 2020 a 4.7/5. We are eternally grateful for all of our volunteers and could not continue our mission without them.

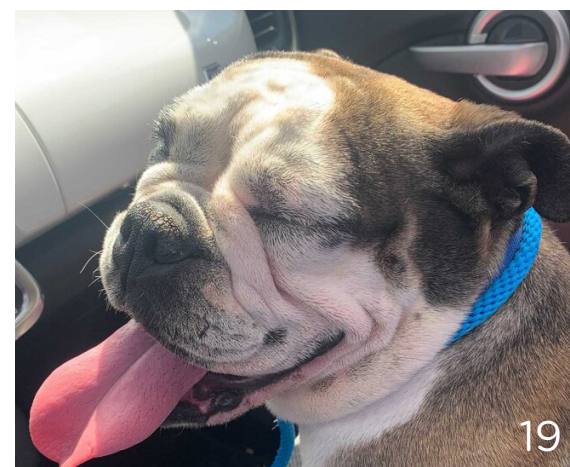

# MEDICAL & TRAINING

Saving dogs with special medical and behavioral needs continued to be a focus area during the pandemic. Our team works diligently with shelter partners to identify special needs dogs who may be a good fit for our program. In 2020, our medical team oversaw the care and rehabilitation of 340 dogs with illnesses and injuries ranging from cancer, tumors, orthopedic surgeries, heart conditions, Parvovirus, Pneumonia/Kennel Cough, and skin issues. Our ongoing medical campaigns continue to help us fund these treatments, but we are always looking for ways to leverage partnerships to reduce our costs. In an effort to reduce routine costs, we partnered with two veterinarians to come to our adoption center and provide basic examinations.

We also worked with more than 60 dogs through our training and behavioral programs in 2020. Our training partners were quick to jump in and help when we had to close the center, including offering to take additional dogs and/or foster. Additionally, the handling skills of our staff at-large have greatly improved over the last year, which improved the behavior of our dogs, as well as our adoption and return rates. To better support our adopters, we introduced a program for virtual Q&A that we will continue throughout 2021 due to its success and value.

# DOROTHY

ADOPTED  
2020

Dorothy, an 8-year-old Schnauzer, was rescued by Wags & Walks after her previous owners no longer wanted her. Having never been taken on a walk or let inside their home, she had lived a life of neglect. Additionally, she had been hit by a car years ago and was never treated for her injuries. Sadly, an injury to her elbow caused constant pain and it was determined that amputation was her best chance of a happy, pain-free life. Dorothy is fully recovered from her surgery and finally experiencing love and affection in her new forever home.



# DEVELOPMENT & OUTREACH PROGRAMS

In March, we transitioned from all in-person events to a fully virtual fundraising strategy. We launched several new programs, in addition to our ongoing and existing ones, as well as refined our processes and organization teamwide. Our first major fundraiser in 2020 was the Crisis Companions Campaign, which raised nearly \$60,000. Throughout the year our team focused on raising funds digitally through medical campaigns, Giving Tuesday, and Home for the Holidays, among others. Additionally, we transitioned our annual benefit gala to a completely virtual auction, raising \$445,000 with very minimal production costs. We exceeded all of our revenue expectations and raised nearly \$1.7 million dollars. Our Development Team continues to build out our donor development and acknowledgement programs with a focus on strengthening relationships with new and existing partners to expand our supporter network.

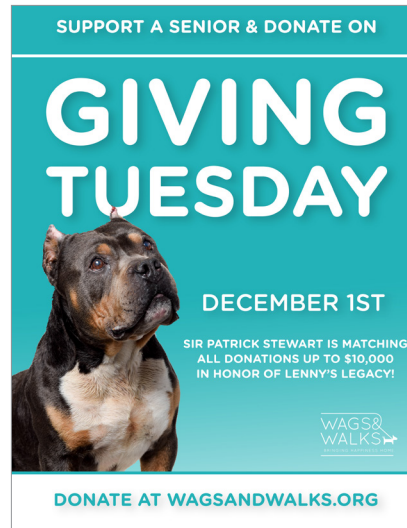

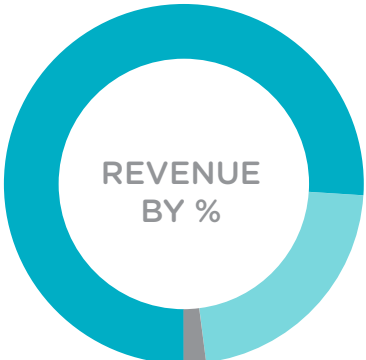
